SHARKS FOOTBALL CLUB

The Sharks is one of the largest clubs in the Yarra Junior Football League, with over 400+ registered players which make up our 17 x teams - 3 x Tackers (U9), $3 \times U10$, $2 \times U11$, $2 \times U12$, $2 \times U13$, $1 \times U14$, $2 \times U15$, $2 \times Colts$ (U16/17). The Sharks also promotes football to those new to the game through our AusKick Program which runs each Saturday morning accommodating more than 130+ children aged 5 and above.

The Sharks work on these visions:

- To provide an opportunity for young and maturing children to have fun and establish new friendships with their teammates.
- To provide a competitive environment for young and maturing children to develop their skills in Australian Rules Football.
- To provide opportunities for young and maturing children to develop both as sports people and as individuals.
- To encourage family involvement across all levels, from supporting through to coaching.
- To ensure that all volunteers are appropriately trained and accredited.

To this end, the Sharks run a development program supported by parents who have played AFL or are working in specialist roles within AFL Clubs. The Sharks also run education evenings which focus on pathways to the AFL and the development of life skills and knowledge around alcohol, drugs, motor vehicle accident and appropriate use of the internet.

Whilst there is a focus on developing our players, parents and helpers, we pride ourselves on being a family oriented football club where we welcome all. This is my second year as President, and I am again well supported by the parents, players and community. LITURGY GROUP

Over the past year we have continued to offer our Parishioners a variety of themes to encourage different groups to participate in our weekly Liturgies.

In June, 2013 we had a Winter Warmers Mass. Hot food was served after Mass and was well received and well attended.

In March we had Sportsman's Mass with few people attending. We hope to improve the numbers for next year with more advertising and a set date.

This year Holy Week was in the second week of the school holidays. All Liturgies where well attended and well received.

Throughout the year we are very blessed to have dedicated teams of people who show up every week, to set up & clean the Church, decorate the foyer, change banners, altar cloths, flowers, lighting, sing or whatever is needed to enhance our weekly Liturgies. LITURGY TEAM

The Liturgy Team is a small and dedicated group. Several members are also choir members. Whilst these roles go hand in hand, it does also create some "conflicts of interest" for major occasions, as those members are not available to assist during the Masses. However, we do manage to recruit helpers, often with a tap on the shoulder before Mass begins to get us through the liturgy.

We meet to discuss, prepare and co-ordinate special Masses (including Introductions, Prayers of the Faithful, Reflections, etc), Forgiveness Rites, flowers for Mothers' Day, Chocolates & bookmarks for Fathers' Day. We prepare the church for various occasions - changing the altar linen for the appropriate liturgical season, putting up relevant banners, decorating the church and preparing the foyer with artwork, messages etc. Many Saturday mornings there will be a bevy of activity going on, attending to the small details which can make a liturgical celebration so much more meaningful, i.e. altar cloths & banners being ironed, or creating a 'focus' near the sanctuary which reinforces the theme of the Mass.

You would have noticed the constant changes to the church environment over the Easter period. This is a huge effort from the team and the many parishioners we "recruit" to assist - to those people we say "Thank you, we couldn't manage without you". We are always looking for new ideas and several members of the team regularly attend workshops run by the Archdiocese specifically to glean new ideas and resources which we can use in our Parish celebrations. These workshops are run on a Saturday from 9am - 4pm, usually before Advent and Lent, however, there are also other times when an opportunity is presented, and someone will go along. There is a music workshop next Sunday afternoon, which 4 of our choir/liturgy members will attend.

Unfortunately our numbers have declined over the past few years, with some members moving away from the parish, or in some cases, life style changes which have meant members are not able to continue. We are all getting older too, which limits our ability to climb ladders etc. We have been fortunate to have great support from Lawry Cecconello, Silvio Volombello & Don Schroder, who often do the climbing & fastening or hanging for us. New members would be very welcome to join us, we would love to have new ideas to re-invigorate our liturgies, so if any one is thinking that they might like to help out, please don't hesitate to ask!

<u>CHOIR</u>

The information gathered from the Parish music survey last year gave us some direction and confirmed that what we are doing is broadly in line with what people want.

ROSARY GROUP/PRAYER FOR PRIESTS

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 7.30 pm to 8.30 pm with rosary prayed from 7.30 pm till 8.00 pm. We are now in our 23rd year and have a core group of 14 or so but seldom have more than 10 people on any given night. During Lent we include The Stations of the Cross. This usually attracts a few extra people.

First Saturday Devotion

This has been going since 1995 in our parish. Again a core group of 12/13 people with 10 most times. Our Lady asked for 5 First Saturdays when she appeared to the 3 children at Fatima, Portugal in 1917. The format is much the same as for Wednesday night, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament immediately after 9.30am mass, plus the rosary and Fatima prayers.

Marian Movement of Prayers for Priests

Meet at 10.00 am each Saturday morning in the Chapel (with the exception of the first Saturday of the month). Most are from our own Parish, but there are people from other Parishes who also join us. We have been praying for Priests through the Immaculate Heart of Mary since 1988, since our Priests are our 'Shepherds' and 'Living instruments of Christ the Eternal Priest'.

TUESDAY CHRISTIAN MEDITATION GROUP

This group has been running in the Parish for 2 years. Every Tuesday morning from 9.15am to 10am during school terms we meet in the Parish Chapel. In the presence of the exposed Host in the Monstrance, we listen as the previous Sunday's Gospel passage is read, followed by a short narrative of this Gospel passage. We then commence 30 minutes of silence with soft background music as an aid to help us meditate or contemplate in our Lord's presence. Usually 3-5 people attend.

I can see this group is of great benefit to our Parish because it is helping people get in touch with the spiritual side of themselves and the obvious benefits of meditation is a new inner awareness and a real sense of true peace, joy and happiness which is only found by being in touch with ourselves, nature and our God.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

The Children's Liturgy program has continued over the past year on both Saturday nights at 6pm and Sundays at 10.30am during school terms. There are 16 current leaders who are all parents or adolescents in our Parish. Two Leaders left during the year due to other commitments. I am about to advertise for additional leaders and one new leader is about to start in Term 2.

Attendances can vary from a couple of children up to about 20 and there is no distinct difference in attendance between Saturdays and Sundays. The average numbers are down on previous years and we recently had no children for liturgy on Sunday 30th March. There were no scheduled class masses which had positively impacted the average numbers during 2012.

We introduced new coloured activity sheets which the children love and are in addition to our usual meditation, reading, discussion and prayers. The children also love listening to all the wonderful songs from our school and Parish. We often play CD's whilst they do their activity. The children love being involved in our mass whether they get to carry the candle, children's cross, bible or being part of the Offertory procession. They all feel very special on these occasions.

SUNDAY HOME COMMUNION MINISTRY

The advice on police checks was revised and we found that we needed some of our volunteers to apply for Working With Children Check and Police Check to continue on the roster. Many thanks to our group of volunteers and may God bless them all.

FAITH DISCUSSION GROUP

Over the course of last year, we continued reading the following Sunday's Gospel and discussing it each week. We used catholic commentaries, including those on various websites to guide our reflections. We also had a time of intercessory prayer each week, praying for the needs of our parish, families, wider community and world.

PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REPORT

During 2013-14, we have continued to use the RCIC model as the pathway for the reception of the sacraments for primary aged children in Grade 3 and above. Children and their parents come along to sessions together and the process follows the same stages as the RCIA.

Twelve families (17 children) participated in this journey of initiation which culminated in reception into the Church at the Easter Vigil (4 children) and Sunday 27th April at the 10.30am Mass. Altogether we celebrated 14 Confirmations and 13 First Eucharist (one family have deferred their reception date until July).

Children's Liturgy at the Saturday night 6pm Mass/Sunday 10.30am Mass was an integral part of the RCIC.

Past High Spirits families continue to be directed to attend children's liturgy on a regular basis and slot into the Parish Sacramental Program where appropriate. Most of these families are not connected to the regular weekend worship. Children's mass and bible story books are available at the door of the Church for children to use at any weekend mass and are well received.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

We have 22 members and meet weekly to review and plan our visits to people who request assistance. Over the past 12 months, we provided the following assistance:

Home visits -365 Assisted 574 adults and 400 children Supermarket food vouchers - \$21,645.00 Donated food - \$10,200.00 Fruit and Vegetable Runs - 45 Bread Runs - 8

Members also do visits in South Melbourne and serve meals at Ozanam House. We derive our funds from our monthly \$2.00 collection, the poor box, donations and proceeds from our shop in Ringwood - we do not receive any Government funding.

97 Christmas hampers and toys were distributed to families in our community. Our Parishes and Schools provided donated food and bedding as part of our annual Winter Appeal.

PASTORAL CARE

Firstly, I would like to give thanks for being gifted with this role as Pastoral Worker at Holy Spirit Parish, North Ringwood. The privilege of working in such a loving and supportive community gives my life much depth, meaning and appreciation of my blessings from Our Lord.

There are two key parts to the life of our Community, our mission and our reason for being.

One is to be a place where God's love revealed in Jesus Christ is proclaimed and where every person can come close to God - a place where they will find love, reconciliation, hope, belonging and a glimpse of the Kingdom of God. A place where they can worship God in spirit and in truth.

The second is to be a community that reflects God's hands and feet in the world - a gathered group of people who love unconditionally, particularly to those most in need. It is a great honour to be part of a parish that does both of these things with great grace and goodness.

We are tremendously lucky having many wonderful volunteers who so generously give of their time and talents to do this work for Our Lord and in turn helps me in my role of Pastoral Worker. The past year 2013 has passed very quickly and in my role at Holy Spirit I have had the honour of working with many of our parish families in preparing, planning and execution of funerals. From May 2013-2014 we have lost 15 people from our community through illness and death. This valuable ministry gives comfort and strength to those grieving and I also offer follow up visits to recently bereaved, when time allows, for them to know that we care about them and for them to sit and share their stories.

Many of our parishioners are also going through the transition of moving from their family homes into Retirement Villages, Units or Nursing Homes which increases home visits due to illness, infirmity or not being able to drive. In many cases through the kindness of others, we provide driving rosters so these parishioners can still attend Sunday worship. Many ill in Nursing Homes or at home receive weekly visits provided so well by our Sunday Communion Ministers who give up their Sunday mornings on a monthly roster to serve our people. Fr. Joe celebrates monthly Masses at Gracedale Nursing Home and Cherry Tree Village, which also includes private visits to those who are not well enough to attend these Masses.

I myself have a roster of approximately 6 parishioners of whom I visit regularly with Eucharist due to the Sunday roster being at capacity. Hospital and home visits to those who are ill, lonely, depressed or struggling with life issues is also a very busy ministry within our Parish.

At times in our lives, we all have crisis and Holy Spirit Parish offers care, love and support to everyone in the parish who asks for our help. Many parents from Holy Spirit Community School come to our door when life becomes too difficult for them to handle and we spend time with a listening ear and we try to find resources for them to tap into which can help them with their problems.

Spiritual and religious issues are often part of a quest for a deeper meaning of life and an understanding of self, so time is spent with parishioners to help them journey through their times of doubt.

Home visits to new parishioners, meeting their families and being made welcome in their homes is a wonderful part of Pastoral Care and I pray that this continues to increase so we can build on the community of Holy Spirit.

I feel that it is most important that we need to keep working hard at approaching more people to help with parish pastoral care, as the demand is certainly much greater than the resources we have. We all must constantly reach out and empower others so that we continue to build on enriching this community and keeping the spirit flowing.

SCHOOL

On behalf of the school community of Holy Spirit Community School it is my pleasure to present the 2013 school report. I wish to point out it would be impossible to explain all highlights/achievements in a limited space of time. This report should be read in conjunction with monthly Parish Pastoral Council reports I deliver.

Student Numbers

August census showed 457 students (313 families) were enrolled; this was slightly down from 2012 but we are still holding on to pleasing enrolments in spite of very strong competition from surrounding schools. In 2013, as with previous years there were 18 classes:

3 x Prep 5 x 1/ 2 5 X 3 / 4 5 X 5/6

Staff

In 2013 Holy Spirit School employed 46 staff. Teachers 18 full –time; 10 part-time, including Principal, Deputy Principal, Student Wellbeing, Reading Recovery, Literacy and Maths,

Office staff – 2 full-time – Bursar and secretary Student Support staff – 11, all part –time. Specialist teachers 4 of Italian, Library, Performing Arts and Physical Education, all part-time. Counsellor -1, part-time. In a number of classes we have shared teaching arrangements where two teachers take the class. Positions of Leadership – Religious Education, Student Services, Learning and Teaching, Maths, Literacy and Level Leaders. Within the above numbers we employed three graduate teachers.

Fees and Levies:

Fees: 94.0% Levies: 97.00% Follow up with non – paid fees continued in 2013. **School Improvements:** 2013 was a relatively minor year for building works, when compared to previous years, with the major item being the construction of the Prep play area which has been a wonderful addition to our school. Obviously continual maintenance works were done to the site.

Academic Results: Data from sources such as NAPLAN show that Holy Spirit continues to provide a quality education. Our continual aim is to improve in all areas of the curriculum. Although our direct involvement in the CTLM project concluded we have maintained a working relationship with ACU and CEOM. As a school we outsourced an IT company, AHH Computer Tutor, to inservice students and staff alike. Religious Education continued to be central to all we did. Weekly 8:30 masses, whole school Masses, sacramental programs, making the children aware of social justice issues, daily prayer and Christian meditation demonstrated our Catholic faith. We are proud to be a Catholic school.

CEOM School Review: Holy Spirit completed our 4 yearly CEOM School Review. This Review required two whole school closure days, numerous staff and leadership meetings. The results will direct our future directions.

Parent Committees: School Board, Parents & Friends, Maintenance, Uniform Shop, OSHC – are valued and are empowered to fulfil their roles. The School Board, P and F, OSHC meet at each month with Maintenance on a needs basis. The works these groups complete around the school are fantastic; they bring so much to our community.

School Parish Links: A great sense of community exists between our School and Parish. The existing links continue to be very strong and highly valued. The cooperation is evident with the sacramental programs, masses, visits by parish to the school, use of the Community Centre etc. The Parish dinners (6 per year) organised by Marisa Smeed and Meagan Whitworth, continue to be an example of ways we strive to build community.


